- ECLI European Case Law Identifier
 - Enables access to cases on European Legislation in all Member States
- ELI European Legislation Identifier
 - Reference mechanism between legislation on European, national and other administrative levels



 - €25 Mio





- European Small Claims Procedure (861/2007)
- European Account Preservation Order (655/2014)
 - Implementation from 18-1-2017
 - Citizens, Companies, Bailiffs, Legal Officers, Banks, Judges and other legal professionals
 - e-SENS develops example digital interaction based on preliminary forms—see examples in next slides
