

Getting from Madrid-Barajas Airport to the City Centre

Metro/Subway (line 8)

The Metro may be the best transport option if you are travelling with light luggage around the city. Madrid-Barajas Airport is directly connected to Madrid Central Station by Metro line 8. The journey takes 22 minutes and costs EUR 3 each way. The Metro station is located within the airport's Terminals 2 and 4. If you arrive at Terminal 1 or 3, you can take a free bus to Terminals 2 and 4. The Metro runs between 06:00 and 01:30. You can find the stops and timetables for line 8 <u>here</u>.

The Renfe Train C-1

The National Railway Company of Spain operates routes to and from Madrid-Barajas Airport on line C-1. The train has 5 stops: Chamartín Station, Nuevos Ministerios Station, Atocha Central Station, Méndez Álvaro Station and Príncipe Pío Station. The train only arrives at Terminal 4. If you arrive at Terminals 1, 2, or 3 you will need to take an internal bus to Terminal 4 (on level 1). If arriving at Terminals 1 or 2, however, the train is not recommended as it is a very long way to the Madrid-Barajas Airport station. The train operates between 06:00 and 11:30 and costs EUR 2,60 each way. The journey to the city centre takes 27 minutes.

Bus

From Madrid-Barajas Airport there is a <u>24/7 express bus</u> to Madrid city centre. The bus is yellow and is located at three airport bus stops right outside Terminals 1, 2 and 4. If arriving at Terminal 3, there is a free airport shuttle that connects all terminals. You could take this shuttle to Terminal 2 or walk there.

During the day, the bus stops at O'Donnell, Plaza de Cibeles and Atocha stations. At night it only stops at O'Donnell and Plaza de Cibeles stations. Travel time to the city centre is approximately 50 minutes and the ticket costs EUR 5. Tickets can be purchased on the bus with cash, by bank card or mobile phone payment.

Madrid Airport Taxi/Transfers

There are taxi ranks outside the 4 terminals at Madrid-Barajas Airport. Taxis in Madrid are white with a diagonal red stripe across the vehicles. Usually a taxi driver will charge a flat rate of EUR 30 to the city centre. Taxi rides are available 24/7 and it will take approximately 20 minutes to get you to the city centre. In order to avoid excessive fees or communication struggles, you can pre-book your Madrid-Barajas airport taxi. Please note that taxi fares will only be reimbursed by ELI if no reasonable alternative is available using public transport and up to a maximum of EUR 40 for the entire trip.



Conference Venues

The best way to get around Madrid is by Metro. Metro fares are calculated by a zone system with the cheapest one-way ticket costing EUR 1,50 or EUR 2. If you will be using the Metro often, consider purchasing a Tourist Card for the number of days you will spend in Madrid. Costs can range from EUR 8,40 to EUR 35,40 for Zone A travel, which includes Madrid's main attractions and popular neighbourhoods. Tourist Cards cover subway, bus and train transport. Metered taxis are also an option and can be hailed on the street or found in ranks throughout the city.



How to Get to Cecilio Rodriguez Garden Pavilion


Opening Reception on Tuesday, 6 September



Venue: <u>Cecilio Rodriguez Garden Pavilion, P^o Del Uruguay 5, 28009 Madrid</u>

Head to the 'Tirso de Molina' bus station (approximately 4 minutes from the city centre) and take <u>the</u> <u>26 bus</u> in the direction Diego de Leon. Disembark at 'Plaza Niño Jesús' (16 minutes, 8 stops). Head north east on Av de Menéndez Pelayo, through the 'Puerta del Niño Jesús' gate and turn right into Parque de El Retiro (El Retiro Park). Continue down this path until you reach P^o Del Uruguay. Take a left onto P^o Del Uruguay and continue straight. The Pavilion is on your right. The walk takes approximately 4 minutes.

How to Get to Palacio De Santoña


Gala Dinner on Wednesday, 7 September



Venue: Palacio De Santoña, Calle de las Huertas 13, 28012 Madrid

Palacio De Santoña is a 5 minute walk from the Metro stop 'Tirso de Molina' and a 3 minute walk from Metro stop 'Antón Martín'. Alternatively, bus lines M1 (stop 'Cascorro') and 002 (stop 'La Latina') take you close to the venue and only require a 3 to 5 minute walk to the Palacio.

Social Event on Thursday, 8 September




Venue: La Lonja Del Mar, Plaza De Oriente, 6, 28013 Madrid

The restaurant is a 3 minute walk from the Opera Metro stop.

From the Opera Metro stop, head north on PI de Isabel II towards Caños del Peral and then turn left onto PI de Isabel II. Continue onto C de Arrieta, then turn left onto C de Felipe V. Finally, turn right onto PI de Ote, the restaurant is on your right.
