

**Webinar**      **“The "algorithmic" Administration and You  
– The updated Handbook of the Council of Europe”**

The Council of Europe published in 2018 the Handbook [“The Administration and You”](#) setting out and explaining the substantive and procedural principles of administrative law concerning relations between individuals and public authorities, with commentary backed up by references to the Council of Europe legal instruments (conventions, recommendations and resolutions) from which each principle is drawn and to the relevant case law of the European Court of Human Rights.

In 2023 a working group, accompanied by two experts, Prof. Braun Binder (University of Basel) and Prof. Cluzel-Métayer (Université Paris Nanterre), and including Prof. Schneider (University of Freiburg) as representative of the ELI, updated the Handbook in the light of the use of artificial intelligence (AI) and non-AI algorithmic systems in administrative law. The amendments highlight the relevance of the existing principles of good administration for the evolving algorithmic administration.

Following a presentation by Prof. Braun Binder and Prof. Cluzel-Métayer the participants will have the opportunity to discuss the various challenges of algorithmic administration for the principles good administration.
